



POST APPROVED LAW ENFORCEMENT DRIVING SKILLS INSTRUCTOR COURSE

Course Description:

This is a 40-hour curriculum intended to provide those attending the skills necessary to instruct LE driving skills in POST approved basic LE academies and agency in-service. This course's curriculum includes:

- Non-Emergency Vehicle Operations (NEVO)
- Emergency Vehicle Operations (EVOC)
- Multi-platform vehicle dynamics (including managing stability control and high center of gravity)
- Dynamic vehicle operations
- Skid control and management
- Multi-tasking
- Instructional methodology
- Coaching skills
- Remedial instruction

There will be a pre-test on the first day that students must successfully complete to attend the full course. This pre-test includes all the Colorado POST approved exercises required by academy recruits to successfully complete an academy, or POST test-out.

Attendees will need to provide an agency vehicle for use in training. 100% attendance and participation is required. Attendees will have to successfully pass both written and physical skills exams to be certified.

- 5 days (40 hours)
- 0800 hours – 1700 hours
- A total of 16 participants maximum
- \$850 per student instructor

LAW ENFORCEMENT DRIVING SKILLS INSTRUCTOR COURSE FAQs

When will training be conducted?

The first day will begin at 0800 hours. The fourth day of training may begin around noon depending on the facility used for training and time of year. All the other days of training will begin at 0800 hours.

What vehicles should be used for training?

Sedan sized vehicles are used for the pretest and for driving skills final. However, due to the increase of SUV use by agencies these can also be used for this course. We encourage participants to bring different vehicle platforms to increase the variety of vehicle dynamics each new driving instructor will experience during the course.

The only vehicle platform that cannot be used for testing and during portions of this course are full sized trucks. If this is the only patrol vehicle your agency has you can still use it for some of the training but will be paired with those who brought a sedan or SUV during portions of the course.



Additionally, please ask your supervisors if your agency's vehicles can be operated by members of law enforcement from other agencies during training.

What equipment should I bring?

Only bring the equipment that is normally assigned to your agency's patrol vehicles. Also, please bring either a work issued, or personal laptop computer for the course. During moments when you are not driving, we ask that you work on your final presentation (each participant will be required to provide a five-minute presentation during the last day). The association will have a few laptops onsite.

What does CLEDSA provide participants for the course?

A thumb drive with the course lesson plans and support documents will be provided on the first day of the course. Diagrams of the driving exercises utilized during the course will also be provided to better the training experience.

What is required to pass the course?

There will be a driving skills pretest the beginning of day one. Attendees must pass this to attend the week's training. There will be a written exam and a physical skills exam on the last day.

Attendees will have to provide a 3-5-minute presentation on the last day. This presentation must have a visual component (i.e. PowerPoint presentation, handouts, props, etc.) and a presentation outline.

Attendees will be required to pass both the written and physical skills exams at 80% or better to be certified.

Where is our Western Slope training conducted?

CLEDSA only trains on the Western Slope at the CLETC training facility located near Grand Junction. It is located at 155 Colorado Highway 141, Grand Junction, CO 81503. The training facility is located beyond the Western Colorado Dragway off CO 141 (32nd Road). The facility is located on the northeast corner of CO 141 and US 50.

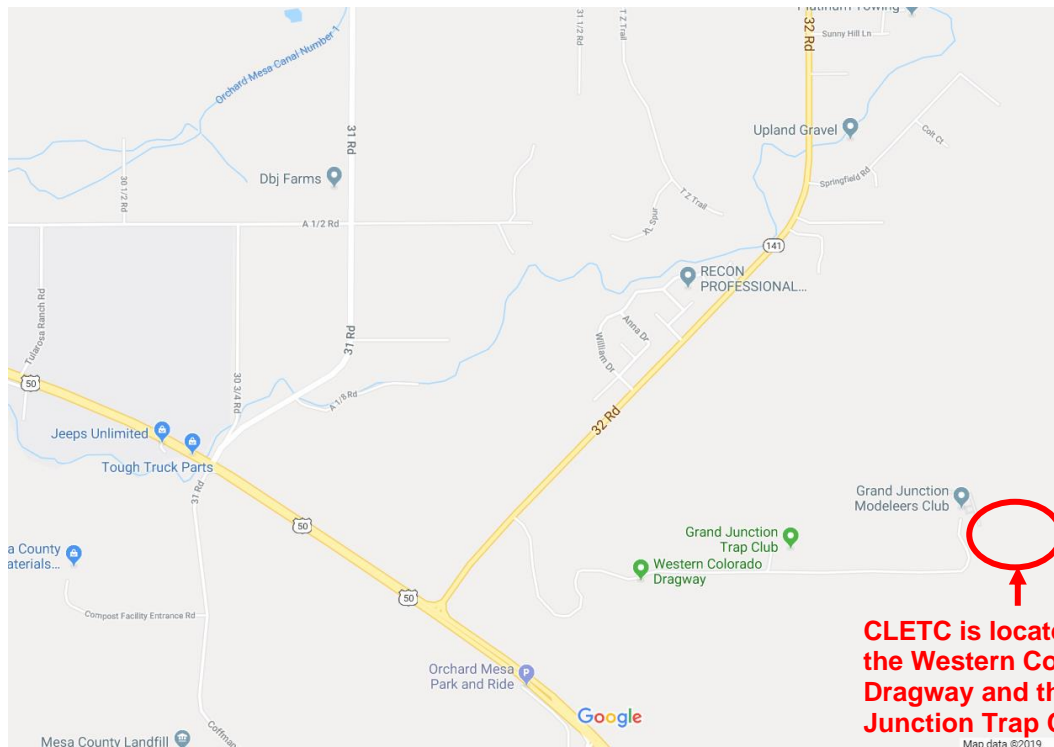
Where is our Front Range training conducted?

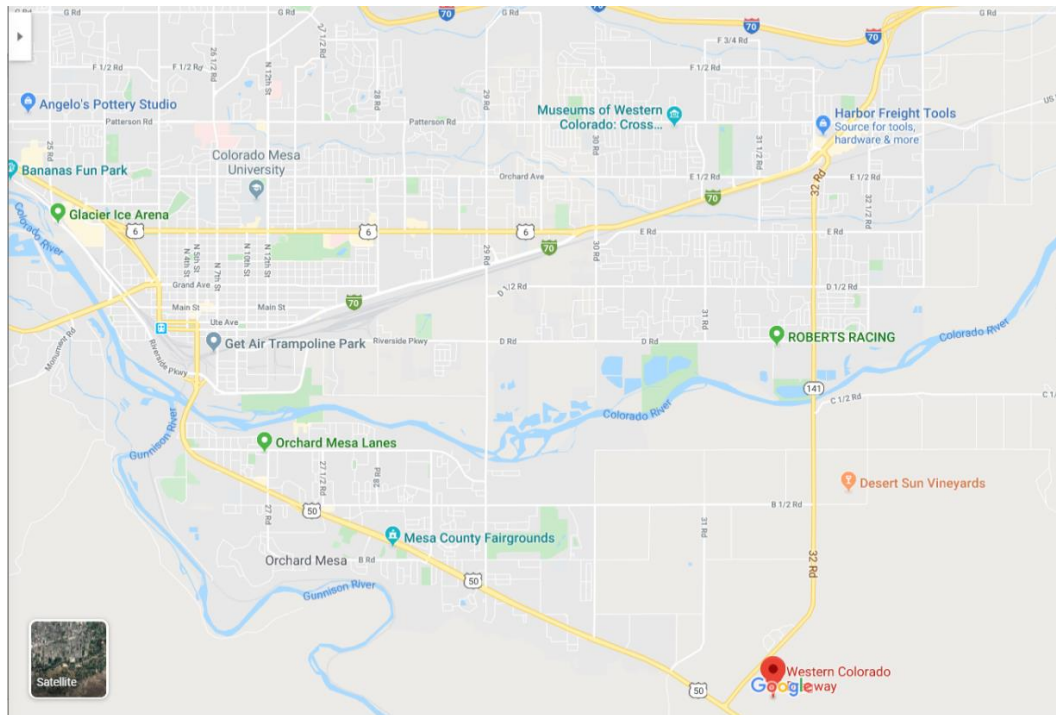

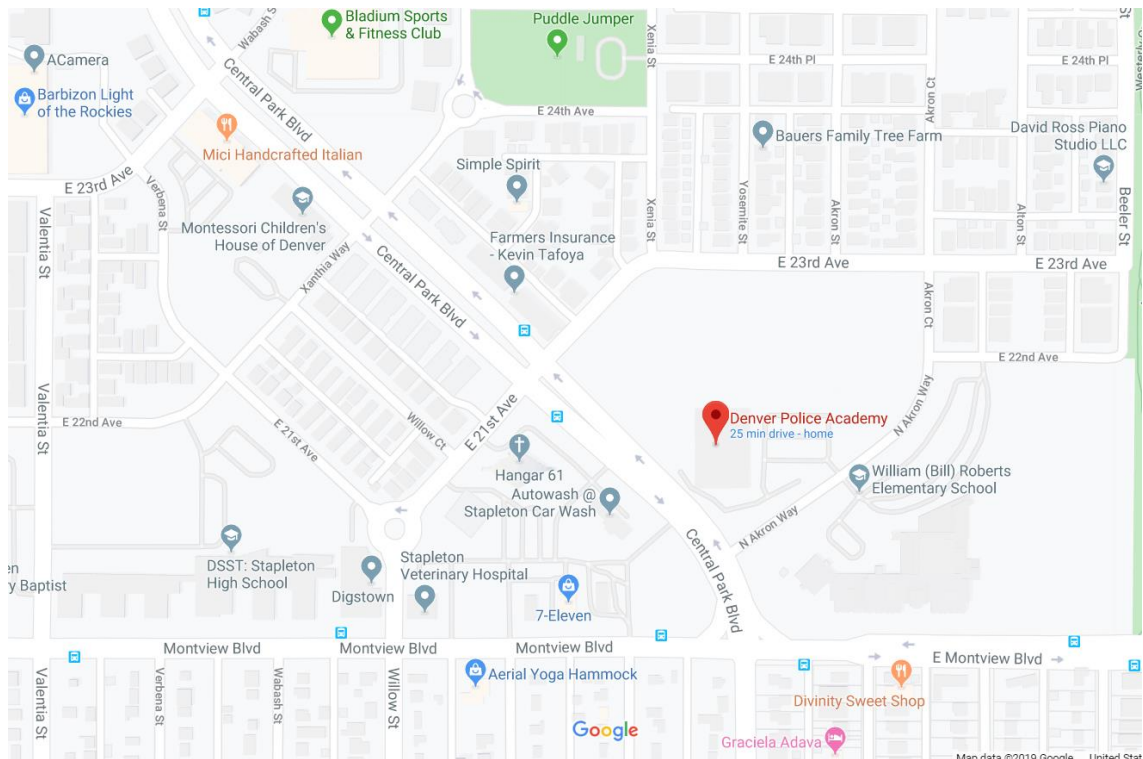

DENVER POLICE ACADEMY



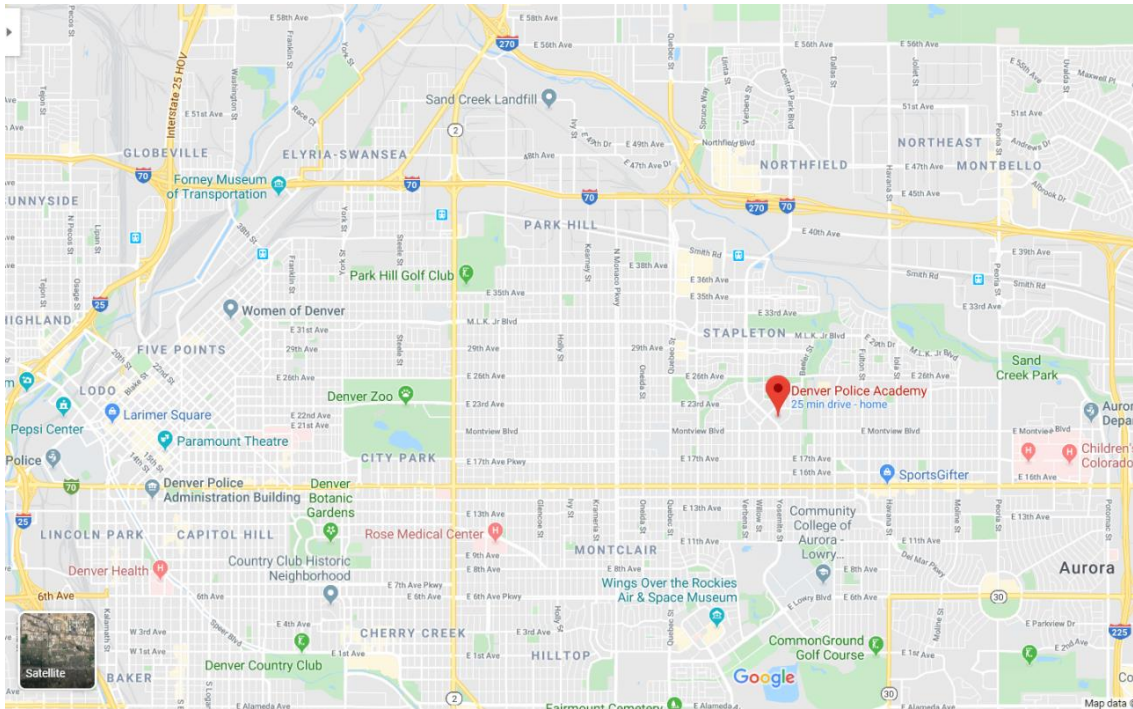

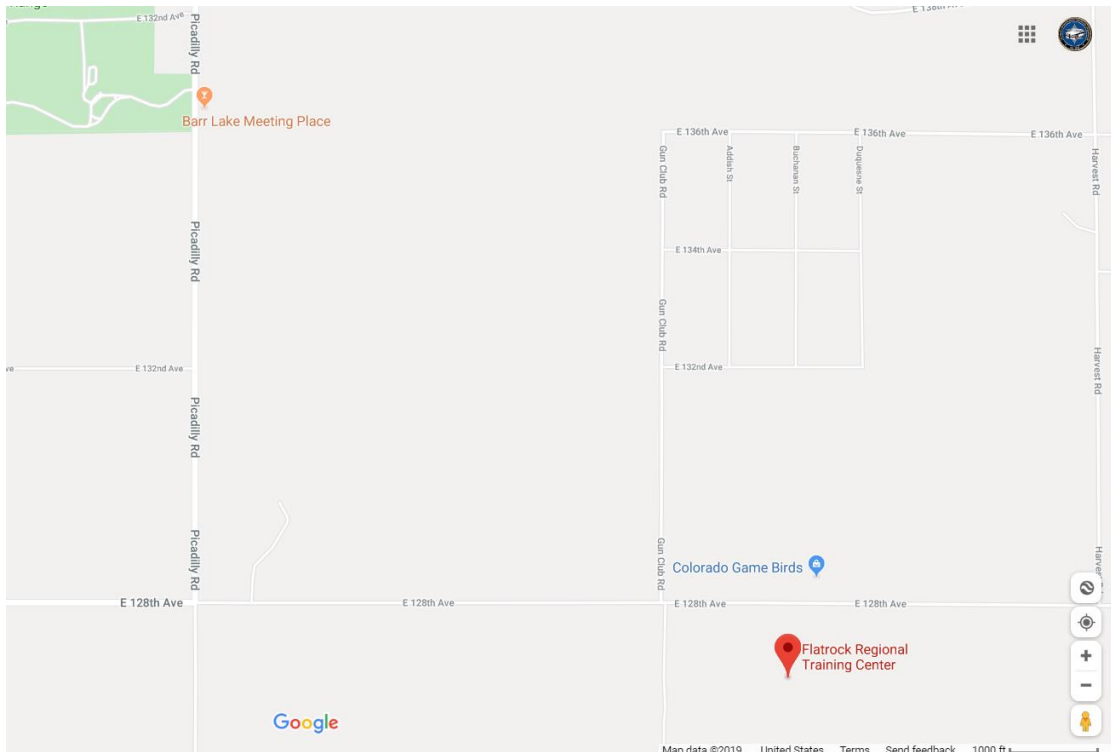
